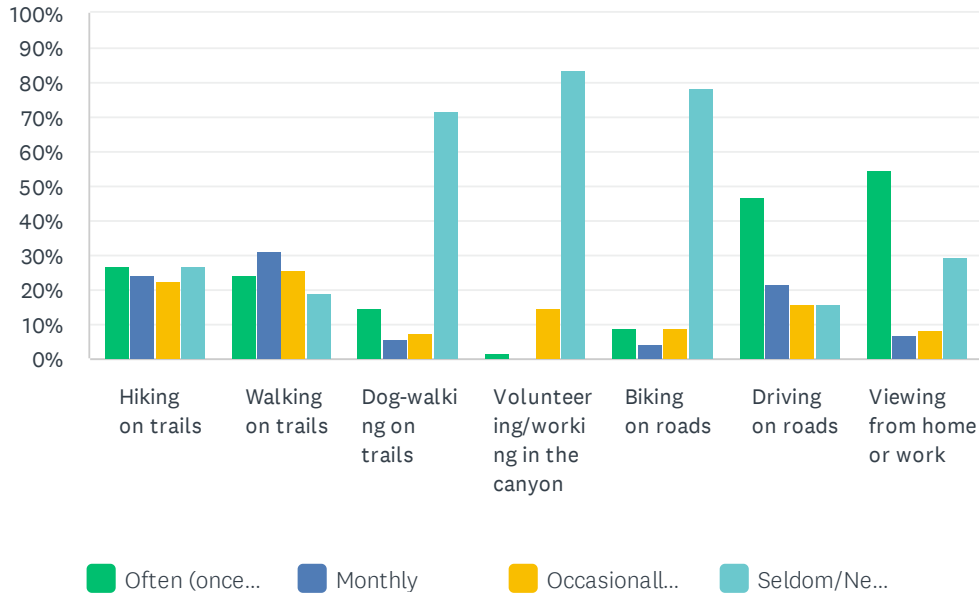


Q1 How often do you enjoy the following activities in and around Claremont Canyon?

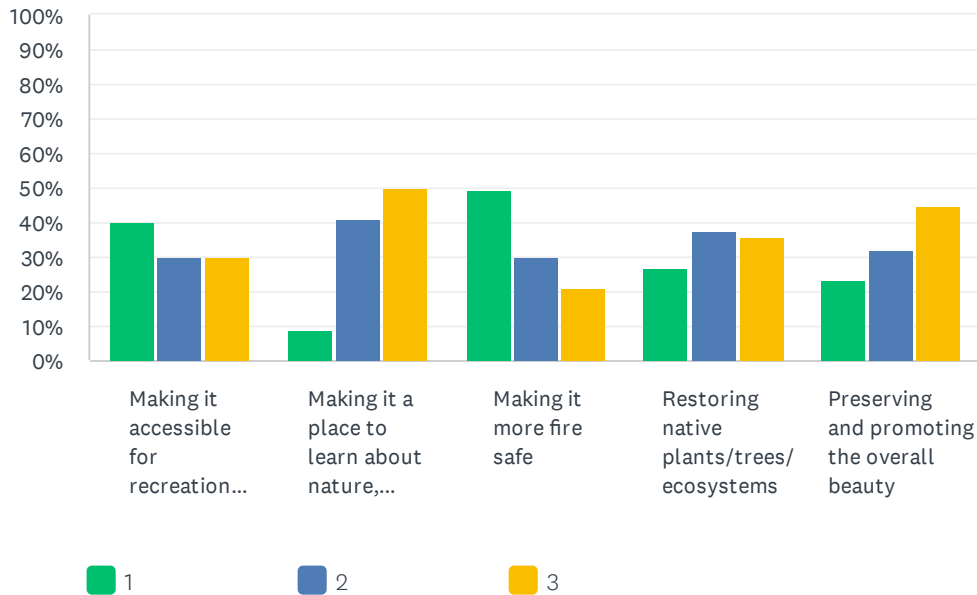

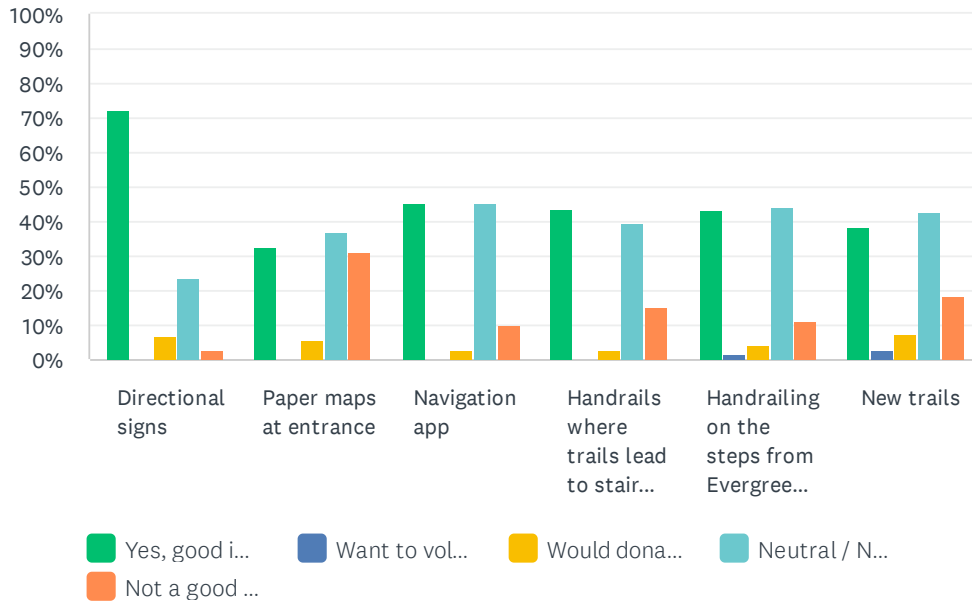

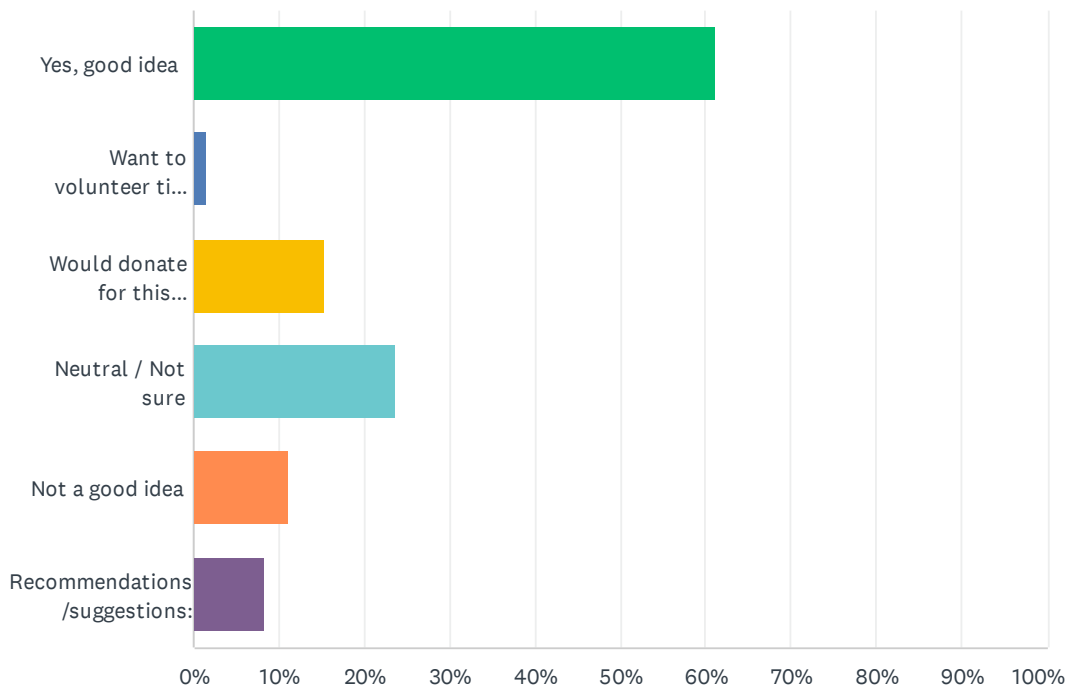
